As I write this article, Rabbi Fasman is undergoing treatment for Small Lymphocytic Lymphoma cancer. addition, we are securing bids for a complete roof replacement. Over time we have made repairs to various sections of the roof but we now must address the entire problem.

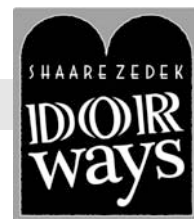

ECC Learns to Distinguish Shabbat Time from School Time

Our children have always enjoyed welcoming the Shabbat at school. We come together to sing songs, dance and celebrate the coming of Shabbat. They enjoy the symbols; two candles, the sweet wine (grape juice), and of course the wonderful tasting challah. All the children eagerly look forward to Shabbat.

In an effort to help them truly understand the separation of Shabbat from the weekdays recently we initiated a Monday morning Havdalah service. Nine o'clock Monday morning, you can find the whole school gathered together in the Chapel Alcove where the Friday before they had welcomed the Shabbat. Hazzan Joanna leads the music with her guitar and begins the ceremony by

lighting a candle, a beautifully braided one of many wicks. We recite the blessing for the wine and lift the spice box reciting the appropriate bracha, enjoying the last sweet reminder of Shabbat.

Holding the candle high the children are learning to cup their hands separating the light from the dark. They hush listening carefully for the sizzle as the brilliant candle is extinguished in the grape juice bringing darkness.

Singing Shavua Tov the children walk to their classrooms to begin the week together with their teachers at Shaare Zedek ECC.

Welcome to March, known on the Hebrew calendar as Adar (Hebrew: אָדָר), the sixth month on the Gregorian calendar, the twelfth month of the religious year on the Hebrew calendar, and is a winter month of 29 days. In leap years, it is preceded by a 30-day intercalary month named Adar Aleph, Adar Rishon (First Adar) or Adar I and it is then itself called Adar Bet, Adar Sheni (Second Adar) or Adar II. Occasionally instead of Adar I and Adar II, "Adar" and "Ve'Adar" are used (Ve means 'and' thus: And Adar). Adar I and II occur during February–March.

Mostly when Adar is here, I think of **Purim** (Hebrew: פּוּרִים) which is a festival celebrated annually according to the Hebrew calendar on the 14th day of Adar (Adar II in leap years), the day following the victory of the Jews over their enemies. Purim begins at sundown on the previous secular day. Purim is characterized by public recitation of the Book of Esther (keriat ha-megillah), giving mutual gifts of food and drink (mishloach manot), giving charity to the poor (mattanot la-evyonim), and a celebratory meal (se'udat Purim). Other customs include reading the Megillat Esther (twice), wearing of masks and costumes, and public celebration. Another is whereas one should only drink a little more than usual and then fall asleep, whereupon one will certainly not be able to tell the difference between arur Haman and baruch Mordecai. Other customs include wearing costumes; eating hamantaschen (tri-cornered baked goods sometimes filled with jam); and the shaking your gragger (noise-maker) to blot out the name of Haman. I know here at SZ we often put on a Purim Spiel (a musical/play telling the story of Purim), so that's something you won't want to miss, if you haven't already been in it or seen it. More information can be found in this bulletin.

Rather than list the "current" on-going programs (they are listed in the previous newsletters), you'll find here the upcoming and new programs for Shaare Zedek.

* DR. JULIA LIEBERMAN, whose recently released book of essays, *SEPHARDI FAMILY LIFE IN THE EARLY MODERN DIASPORA* is the focus of a new study group, which started with a LUNCH AND LEARN on Saturday February 12 and then the first class was on February 21st. All the other dates are on Monday evenings from 7:00 - 8:30 p.m., on **March 7, March 21, and April 4**. Because you will be studying from the book, they are being made available to you for \$20 (checks made payable to Shaare Zedek and sold to those participating in the class, before being available to others.) There was also a registration/tuition fee for non-members (\$18), which needed to be paid before the first class. Members and friends are invited to join this study group to examine the issues raised in the volume. She will present a talk entitled: "Who are the Iberian Jews? Why was there an Inquisition in Spain and Portugal." Historical backgrounds will be explained. No reading is required for the Lunch and Learn, although a syllabus will be made available for those interested in joining the class. During the 16th and 17th centuries many Jews in Spain and Portugal who had converted to Christianity to survive the inquisition migrated to communities of the Ottoman empire as well as to cities such as Amsterdam and Hamburg. The six essays, including one by Professor Lieberman, address issues faced by the Sephardi communities as they absorbed the newcomers.

* Rabbi Ryan Dulkan will continue his Shabbat book group on **March 19th** at 10:00 - 11:00 a.m. They usually meet in the Community Room.

* Dr. Burton Boxerman will lead a Lunch and Learn discussion on the topic, the Triangle Shirtwaist fire, which occurred on March 25, 1911. So a 100 years and a day later (on March 26th), we will find out what happened.

* Knitting group will get together on March 27th at 10:45 a.m. in the Community Room. Newcomers welcome.

* Rabbi Mark Fasman will continue to hold his Tuesday evening classes, but check with the calendar or office (314-727-1747) for the Session III classes.

Bring us your tzedakah!

Shaare Zedek USY (SZSL) is teaming up with Rabbi Fasman to collect Change for Change.

Last Purim, SZ members were sent a personal pushke to collect coins for this special project.

Collect your spare change every day. Bring in your spare coins and our USY members will load 'em into our counting machine and donate YOUR tzedakah to a worthy organization.

Look for the collection boxes and our change counting machine at synagogue events.

Together, we can help change the world!

Tzedakah is commonly translated as charity, but the word itself is based on the Hebrew word צדק, (tzedek) meaning righteousness, fairness, or justice. Tzedakah refers to the religious obligation to perform charity, and philanthropic acts. Unlike philanthropy, tzedakah is seen as a religious obligation.

It is argued that the Biblical regulations concerning left-overs only applied to corn fields, orchards, and vineyards; and the classical rabbinical writers were very strict in regard to who could receive the remains. It was stated that the farmer was not permitted to benefit from the gleanings, and was not permitted to discriminate among the poor. The farmer was not even allowed to help one of the poor to gather the leftovers.

It is also argued that the law was only applicable in Canaan, although many classical rabbinical writers who were based in Babylon observed the laws there.

Maimonides lists his Eight Levels of Giving, as written in the Mishneh Torah, Hilkhot Matanot Aniyim (Laws about Giving to Poor People) Chapter 10:7-14

1. Giving an interest-free loan to a person in need; giving a grant to a person in need
2. Giving tzedakah anonymously to an unknown recipient via a person (or public fund) who is trustworthy, wise, and can perform acts of tzedakah with your money in a most impeccable fashion
3. Giving tzedakah anonymously to a known recipient
4. Giving tzedakah before being asked
5. Giving tzedakah publicly to an unknown recipient
6. Giving adequately after being asked
7. Giving willingly, but inadequately
8. Giving "in sadness" - it is thought that Maimonides was referring to giving because of the sad feelings one might have in seeing people in need (as opposed to giving because it is a religious obligation; giving out of pity)

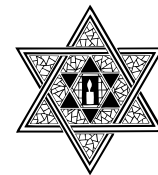
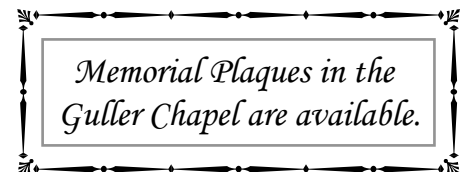
